



Special Police Officer SECURITY PROGRAM UPDATE

The Department of Licensing and Consumer Protection (DLCP), Occupational and Professional Licensing (OPL), Security Program will implement an administrative policy change related to the expiration date for specific license types. This change will impact Security Officers (SO), Special Police Officers (SPO), Special Campus Police (SCP) and Security Agencies licenses. These licenses will now expire based upon the date of issuance and/or last renewal date.

Our goal with this change is to allow us to:

- Simplify the licensing process and
- Allow license holders and businesses to receive the maximum benefit of their license(s).

The license term will now use the date of issuance and/or last renewal date. The previous practice relied on a set expiration date that often results in a license duration that may have been significantly less than the full license term.

License Type	Ranawal	New Kenewal	District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR)

As a result of this change, your revised SPO license terms have been updated. Please go here to review your new license terms.

You will receive a renewal notification within 90 days of your revised expiration date allowing you to begin your license renewal process. DLCP must receive your renewal application and all supporting documentation at least 15 days prior to the expiration date (shown above) to ensure enough time to process your application before its expiration.

Application and supporting documentation required:

- Completed (Paid) Application
- <u>Notarized Arrest Affidavit</u>(including dispositions for arrests)
- Notarized Authorization to Release Information Form
- Drug Screening (6 panel with levels)
- Health/Physical Examination
- Fingerprint Receipt
- Range Certificate (minimum 8 hours)
- Must be affiliated with an "active" licensed Security Agency Business or Security Agency Individual

If your renewal application and supporting documentation are not received by the application date deadline 15 days prior to expiration, your license will be set as "expired", and you will be required to apply for a "new" special police officer license.

If an application is incomplete and any additional supporting documents requested by DLCP during the renewal process are not received by the expiration date, your license will be set as "expired" and you will be required to apply for a "new" special police officer license.
